## FUNDRED beyond the classroom



**Participation can have profound lessons beyond the classroom setting.** Inspire **school-wide participation** by talking to your principal, other teachers, and the entire student body; **escalate participation to the district level!** Or organize a Fundred Task Force: working with others is inspirational and fun. Here are a few suggestions to get your Fundred-efforts going:

- Fundred is simple and fun to teach. **Your students can visit other classrooms** and/or other schools to help other students get involved. Students can set up tables at art or environmental fairs, special events, etc.
- Fundred is a good fit with **service learning**: partner with the service learning coordinators in your district! Give your students a chance to lead community participation in Fundred.
- Contact colleges and universities in your area and enlist their participation. They have education, art education, community arts and communication arts departments who can reach out to their networks.
- Anyone and everyone can contribute Fundreds. There is **no age limit!** Parents, grandparents, and community can all be a part of your school's Fundred participation.
- Girl Scouts may be interested, especially since a girl scout patch is available (see Extra Fundred Fun under Get Involved > More Resources at fundred.org). Boy Scouts too!
- Contact Boys & Girls Clubs of America or other **after school programs**.
- Reach out to other community groups or faith based organizations – let them know you can provide templates or contact fundred.org for templates on their behalf!
- City Council, mayor, or local celebrities can help **spread the word**. Contact your mayor and ask for a "**Fundred Day**."
- Work with **local news** outlets, including TV, radio, online blogs, newspapers, school papers, social networking sites, etc. **to get the word out about your Fundred efforts!** Local media is always interested in a story that involves children, education, environment and local engagement with national implications.
